Examples of "special needs" include speech recognition software, Braille keyboards, improved wheelchair access, or a TDD business line.

Managers and instructors are often unaware of resources that could help those with special needs. Additionally, they may be unaware of ethical guidelines that are also important in such cases. The Special Needs Committee is the first STC-supported endeavor to address these gaps.
